Which Doctors, Hospitals, and Pharmacies Can I Use?

Banner – University Care Advantage has a network of doctors, hospitals, pharmacies, and other providers. If you use the providers that are not in our network, the plan may not pay for these services.

You must generally use network pharmacies to fill your prescriptions for covered Part D drugs.

Monthly Plan Premium

You pay nothing

You must continue to pay your Medicare Part B premium.

The monthly Part B premium is paid for by the State in some cases. Your cost-sharing is determined by your level of Medicaid eligibility.

Deductible

This plan has deductibles for some hospital and medical services.

\$0 or \$198 in 2020; for Part B in-network services. Medicare Part A deductible is \$0 or \$1,408 in 2020.

These amounts may change for 2021. The plan will provide updated rates as soon as Medicare releases them.

Your cost-sharing is determined by your level of Medicaid eligibility

Maximum Out-of-Pocket Responsibility

(does not include prescription drugs)

Like all Medicare health plans, our plan protects you by having yearly limits on your out-of-pocket costs for medical and hospital care.

In this plan, you may pay nothing for Medicare-covered services, depending on your level of AHCCCS (Medicaid) eligibility.

Your yearly limit(s) in this plan:

- \$7,550 for services you receive from in-network providers for Medicare-covered services.

If you reach the limit on out-of-pocket costs, you keep getting covered hospital and medical services and we will pay the full cost for the rest of the year.

Refer to the "Medicare & You" handbook for Medicare-covered services. For AHCCCS (Medicaid)-covered services, refer to the Medicaid Coverage section in this document.

Please note that you will still need to pay your monthly premiums and cost-sharing for your Part D prescription drugs.

The most you pay for copays, coinsurance and other costs for medical services for the year is \$7,550.

Inpatient Hospital Coverage

The co-pays for hospital and skilled nursing facility (SNF) benefits are based on benefit periods. A benefit period begins the day you're admitted as an inpatient and ends when you haven't received any inpatient care (or skilled care in a SNF) for 60 days in a row. If you go into a hospital or a SNF after one benefit period has ended, a new benefit period begins. You must pay the inpatient hospital deductible for each benefit period.

There's no limit to the number of benefit periods.

Our plan covers 90 days for an inpatient hospital stay. Our plan also covers 60 "lifetime reserve days." These are "extra" days that we cover. If your hospital stay is longer than 90 days, you can use these extra days. But once you have used up these extra 60 days, your inpatient hospital coverage will be limited to 90 days.

In 2020, the amounts for each benefit period were:

- \$0 or \$1,408 deductible for days 1 through 60
- \$352 copay per day for days 61 through 90
- \$704 copay per day for 60 lifetime reserve days

These amounts may change for 2021. The plan will provide updated rates as soon as Medicare releases them.

Authorization and/or a referral from your doctor is required for specialist visits.

Your cost-sharing is determined by your level of Medicaid eligibility.

Mental Health Services

Inpatient visit

Our plan covers up to 190 days in a lifetime for inpatient mental health care in a psychiatric hospital.

The inpatient hospital care limit does not apply to inpatient mental services provided in a general hospital.

The co-pays for hospital and skilled nursing facility (SNF) benefits are based on benefit periods. A benefit period begins the day you're admitted as an inpatient and ends when you haven't received any inpatient care (or skilled care in a SNF) for 60 days in a row.

If you go into a hospital or a SNF after one benefit period has ended, a new benefit period begins. You must pay the inpatient hospital deductible for each benefit period. There's no limit to the number of benefit periods.

Our plan covers 90 days for an inpatient hospital stay.

Our plan also covers 60 "lifetime reserve days." These are "extra" days that we cover. If your hospital stay is longer than 90 days, you can use these extra days. But once you have used up these extra 60 days, your inpatient hospital coverage will be limited to 90 days.

In 2020 the amounts for each benefit period were:
